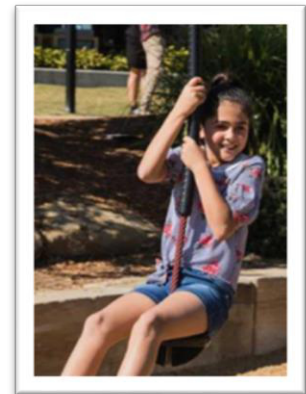


Ruskin Park Play Equipment



Double Cableway

The Double Cableway is the ultimate social dare devil attraction. It will support social play again and again, children racing each other to the end, competing speed as they go. And they will go, again and again. The reason for this solid holding power lies mainly in the immense thrill of gliding through the air. The feeling of weightlessness and the swooshing through the air trains spatial awareness as well as the child's understanding of gravity, space, and speed. This is necessary e.g. in managing traffic safely. The social skills get trained as children diligently hand back the seat to the next user in line. The running and pulling involved in this trains the child's cardio as well as upper body muscles. All in all, the large cableway is an asset of play that unites generations and abilities as there is some way for almost everyone to use it.

The design of the start section for a cableway oozes stability and spaciousness. The start section facilitates turn-taking and cooperation when handing over the cable glider to others. Getting up on the platform stimulates important motor skills as balance and coordination.

Junior Swings



WeHopper

The thrilling activity of rotating, rocking and cooperating with a friend is hugely appealing to children of all ages. The WeHopper is perfect in size for young children, and their enthusiasm in mastering the activity is pure play. When pushing with the feet and pulling with the arms, the WeHopper is set into motion. This trains coordination skills as well as muscles. The handholds allow for different grip heights so that a span of ages are able to get a firm grip. When rotating, the children stimulate their sense of balance, which is fundamental for all other motor skills and involves the ability to for instance sit still on a chair. The coordination of movements for the individual child, and not least the coordination of movements together with a friend, takes concentration and body mastery. This stimulates social skills, and it builds confidence in movement, supporting self-efficacy.



Giants Junior Multiplay Unit



The Giant L's high climb-balance-slide meet features attract children hugely. The Giant has a unique variety of speedy sliding and gliding, gentle swaying and not least challenging climbing activities. All these are in a see-through tower, promoting thrill and social interaction. This ensures vigorous play, over and over. The open and closed slide and the fireman's pole and banister bars offer each their fast ride. This is severe fun and it stimulates social-emotional skills such as self-regulation and empathy. The balance bridge and the many climbing activities add thrill to the open towers also. This stimulates cross-coordination, and the senses of balance and space, useful in e.g. managing street traffic. On the ground level there is room for socializing in the swaying hammocks. This adds an active rest point to make friends in play.



Supernova



Use your strength and hold your balance! This seems to be the best way to describe the kind of play that takes place on the Supernova. A single child can engage in exploring its possibilities, but together with a whole group of friends, this play item expresses its real potential. The large, slanting ring is set in motion by the children; turning, spinning, balancing or just enjoying the ride are among the countless play options of the ever-popular Supernova.

Four Tower Toddler Multiplay Unit

This fantastic four tower structure will inspire young children to play actively, using their muscles to climb, slide and glide to the ground. The richness of variety in climbing options provides age-appropriate challenges to strengthen muscles and help develop cross coordination skills. Strengthening physical cross-coordination skills enhances children's abilities to use both sides of their brain and supports the internal structures that enable reading and thinking. The U-net provides a swaying, climbing opportunity for all. It can be used to get from one play tower to the next or can be used as a rest point hammock. The sturdy desk at ground level extends the play space and invite children to play together. The slides and pole support posture and balance, all important skills for young children as they grow, and great physical fun.



Inclusive Home Seesaw

Flowers, bees and butterflies hand out invitations for a beautiful trip around the garden. Safely seated at both ends with hands and feet positioned on secure bars, the youngest children will enjoy a good rocking. The more experienced participant can sit or stand on the centre plate, from where they can influence the ride considerably. Everyone involved will have to cooperate, to work out how to make the ride a success for all. The soothing movement makes children want to sing and enjoy the rhythm.

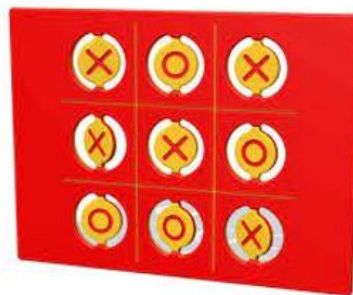


Fire Truck
